

Panel Reviews of Children Ages 0-5

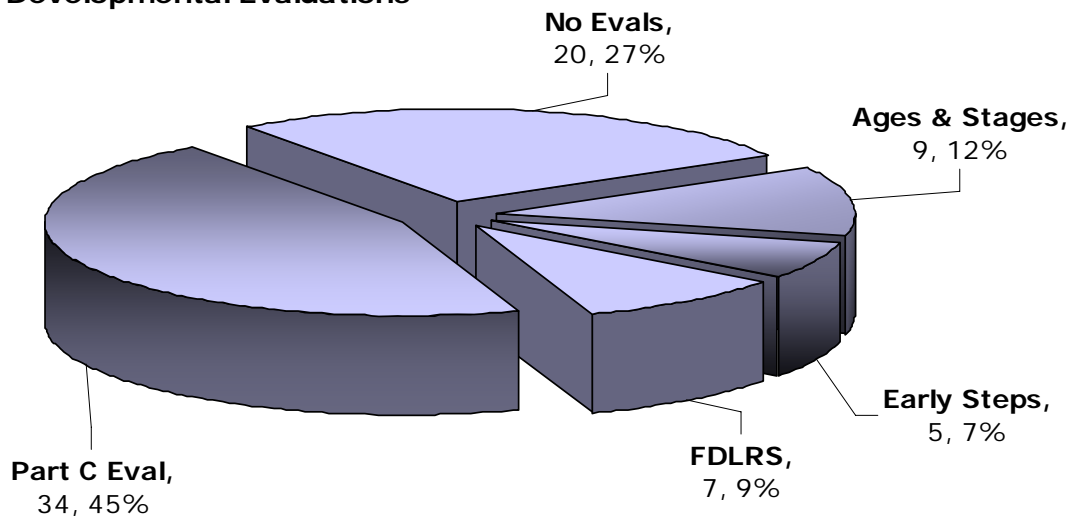
What does the Data Tell Us?

From October 2008 to June 2009, FCR has reviewed a total of 75 children ages birth to five years old.

Developmental Evaluations

Our data indicates that out of the 75 children ages birth to five that we have reviewed, over half, or 73%, have received a developmental evaluation (Ages & Stages screening, Part C evaluation, or child has been evaluated by FDLRS or Early Steps).

Developmental Needs

Of the 75 children reviewed, 55, or 73%, are not meeting the developmental milestones for their age. Unfortunately, only 20 children, or 27%, are developmentally on target.

Not Developmentally on Target	73%	55
Developmentally on Target	27%	20

Of the 55 children that are not developmentally on target, they are either medically needy, or are receiving physical, speech and/or occupational therapy. It is important to note that a child can have more than one developmental need, and usually he/she does. Many children receive more than one type of therapy.

Of the 75 children reviewed –

Developmental Issue	# of children	%
Medical Issues	19	25%
Physical Therapy	13	17%
Speech Therapy	20	27%
Occupational Therapy	12	16%
