# FLORIDA FOSTER CARE REVIEW

Florida Foster Care Review (FFCR) was founded in 1989 by community members who believed that volunteer-based citizen review panels were essential to ensuring the safety and welfare of the thousands of children in Miami's foster care system at the time. More than thirty years later. FFCR has matured into a full-fledged non-profit organization. Our Review Panel Program's trained Citizen volunteers, guided by our expert staff, conduct in-depth review hearings for each child referred by the court, identify unmet needs and recommend solutions. Our Permanency **Roundtable Program** convenes and facilitates action-oriented teams focused on securing forever families and lifelong, supportive adult relationships for youth in foster care.

## OUR IMPRCT

#### Our Permanency Roundtable (PRT) Program builds and activates a team of professionals and lay people who break through barriers in pursuit of lifelong adult connections and forever families.

By the time 12 year-old Mike\* was referred to FFCR's PRT Program, he had already been in foster care 6 years. Mike was struggling with mental health, emotional and behavioral issues.

During his time in the system, he had bounced between foster homes and, at one point, he required residential psychiatric treatment. Mike's younger siblings had all been adopted, and, although a number of families had been interested in adopting him, each one had fallen through.



The PRT team embraced the challenge, and they were determined to find the right family for Mike. FFCR's experienced staff facilitated the team's creation and implementation of a permanency action plan specifically tailored to Mike's unique needs. Among the many efforts made, the team conducted an expansive search for family members and highlighted Mike on several new adoption recruitment websites. Eventually, through perseverance and persistence, the PRT team found a family with 3 adopted children who also had significant emotional and behavioral needs. After extensive discussions with the team and many visits, it was clear that this was the right family for Mike. With support and guidance from his therapist, the PRT team transitioned Mike to his new family.

After almost 10 years in foster care and a lifetime of disappointments, Mike finally had his forever family. The whole team participated in the adoption proceeding via zoom and watched through tears as Mike and his adoptive parents proudly wore matching t-shirts. Mike poignantly reflected that he thought he would never be adopted, and he couldn't believe it was actually happening.



#### Each child reviewed by our Citizen Review Panel (CRP) Program receives individualized attention and a set of recommendations tailored to address their specific needs.

The 5 Smith<sup>\*</sup> children entered foster care in late 2019. After about a year, the juvenile court judge overseeing their case referred the children to the CRP Program. Prior to the scheduled review hearing, CRP staff and volunteers read the case manager's lengthy report and combed through stacks of documentation detailing the children's history, special needs and the services they had received. During the review, CRP members discovered that the 5 siblings had not consistently visited with each other for nearly a year. They also learned that the adoptions process had stalled and that each child had one or more unaddressed medical, developmental and/or educational need.

To ensure timely compliance with the many recommendations issued by the panel for each child, FFCR staff requested a special hearing before the judge who had referred the Smith siblings to the CRP. During the hearing, the judge asked the parties to provide an update regarding their compliance with the CRP's recommendations. Based on the CRP's findings, the judge ordered the agency to ensure that the children visited with each other in person at least once a month. He also required the agency to finalize the children's adoptions and decided to hold monthly hearings to monitor the provision of tutoring and educational accommodations for one of the children who was struggling in school.

Acknowledging how difficult it would have been for him to identify so many issues on his own, the judge thanked FFCR's representative for the objective, individualized attention of the Citizen Review Panel on behalf of the five Smith children.
